

A message from the Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner

We are in the midst of a very challenging situation with Coronavirus (COVID-19) fundamentally changing the way we work and live. This is also impacting the way you carry out your role as an emergency services volunteer. I am reaching out to reassure you that DFES will keep you informed of this rapidly changing situation and what it means for emergency services, to ensure you have the support and information you need to stay safe and continue to protect your communities.

I am working alongside the Minister for Emergency Services, the WA Police Commissioner and other State Government agencies to respond to the evolving COVID-19 situation. Within DFES, a COVID-19 Incident Response Team is implementing strategies to ensure DFES staff and volunteers' safety and wellbeing remains the top priority, while ensuring we can continue to deliver vital frontline services to the WA community.

As this situation evolves, it's crucial that you stay up to date with information as it comes to hand. The dedicated COVID-19 Information page on the <u>Volunteer Hub</u> is your primary source of information. This page contains the latest information on how DFES is responding to the changing COVID-19 situation and the impact it has on you as an emergency services volunteer.

I understand that reduced interaction with your fellow volunteers may make this time even more difficult for some.
