### STATE AERIAL FIREFIGHTING FLEET 2023/2024

### **Key Information**

The following information outlines the earlier start times for some of the State aerial firefighting aircraft types and their bases (locations) for the 2023/2024 southern bush fire season.

Information regarding the remainder of the aerial fleet will be issued when finalised.

#### Jandakot Airport:

## 25 October 2023, available daily 0900-1800hrs

- 2 x Bell 214B (2,650lts per aircraft) HELITAKS
- 1 x AS355 Twin Squirrel FIREBIRD helicopter Air Attack Supervision (AAS)
- 1 x AS365 N3 Dauphin *FIREBIRD* helicopter (utility, all-hazards response)

# 1 November 2022, available daily 0900-1800hrs

- 1 x AS365 N3 Dauphin *FIREBIRD* helicopter (Air Intel Tactical Intelligence Surveillance Reconnaissance (ISR).)
- 1 x B200 King Air Linescanner FIRESCAN aircraft (FSCN 125 Strategic ISR)

Commencement Date to be advised (DBCA), available daily 0600-1800hrs.

- 3 x AirTractor 802 fixed wing (3,150lts per aircraft) SEATs/BOMBERS
- 1 x Champion Scout BIRDDOG light fixed wing (AAS)
- 1 x AS350 Squirrel *FIREBIRD* helicopter (AAS)
