16 Days in WA Campaign

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) is proud to support the 16 Days in WA campaign; to drive change in culture, behaviour and attitudes, that lead to violence against women and children. The campaign takes place from 25 November, International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, to 10 December, Human Rights Day.

The 2024 campaign theme is *Stopping Family and Domestic Violence: Play your part*. This campaign takes its inspiration from the global 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence.

This year's campaign coincides with the launch of the new <u>Coercion Hurts</u> campaign, to raise awareness that coercive control is a harmful form of family and domestic violence (FDV). Visit the <u>Coercive control website</u> for further information and support resources.

Collection Boxes

DFES has collaborated with The Essentials Collective, a not-for-profit organisation who will be providing branded donation boxes for new and unused toiletries and underwear.

These boxes will be placed at DFES offices at Cockburn Central, Como and Forrestfield and staff are encouraged to donate essential items. The essential items collected will be distributed to those in need through local shelters, charities and outreach services, that have a particular focus on supporting women escape family violence, homelessness, and at-risk youth.

- toothpaste and toothbrushes
- deodorant
- underwear and bras
- socks
