Western Australia (WA) Harmony Week is about inclusion, diversity, and respect. This year's theme is 'Everyone Belongs'.

Did you know that WA is one of the most culturally and linguistically diverse States in Australia? In WA, more than 32.2% of Western Australians were born overseas. People from more than 200 different countries live, work and study in Western Australia, speak as many as 270 languages and identify with more than 100 religions.

At <u>DFES</u>, 23.1% of our staff were born overseas, with 10.6% being fluent in a language other than English. DFES is committed to valuing our culturally and linguistically diverse (CaLD) workforce and the community we serve, as outlined in our <u>Multicultural Action Plan</u>.

Celebrating Harmony Week is one way we show appreciation for our cultural, religious, linguistic and ethnic diversity, while recognising that there are still barriers to remove to improve inclusivity in our workplace and community.
