STATE AERIAL FIREFIGHTING AIRCRAFT END DATES

Key Message

Aerial fire suppression aircraft will cease operations for the 2024/2025 southern bush fire season, as detailed below.

What's happening?

A managed approach has commenced to reduce the number of aerial fire suppression aircraft based on a detailed risk assessment process. End dates for aerial fire suppression aircraft are listed below. Some dates are dependent upon review of seasonal conditions and updates will be announced if necessary.

What does it mean for me?

Operational personnel should familiarise themselves with the dates on which aerial fire suppression services will cease.

Aerial firefighting mobilisation according to automatic and enhanced response zone procedures will continue as per each Region's High Threat Period until either the end of the High Threat Period or the cessation of the relevant aerial firefighting services, whichever occurs first; reference Operational Circular 06/2025.
